Allen Hopper is an attorney and consultant with 20+ years of criminal justice and drug policy experience, including more than a decade as a civil rights attorney and legislative policy advocate for the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU). Mr. Hopper brings extensive policy and litigation experience in drug law enforcement, medical marijuana implementation and broader marijuana law reform to help clients navigate local, state and federal laws and regulations, and to envision and implement innovative public safety and criminal justice solutions with an emphasis on alternatives to incarceration and cannabis regulation. At the ACLU of California he founded and directed the state-wide Criminal Justice and Drug Policy Project (CJDP), developing strategies to reform California's criminal justice system and drug policies and down-size California jails and prisons. From 2004 through 2010, Mr. Hopper was the Litigation Director of the National ACLU's Drug Law Reform Project, where he coordinated the ACLU's drug policy litigation strategy, combining impact litigation with policy and legislative advocacy and public education to transform public understanding of, and government response to, drug use and the nation's drug policies. Mr. Hopper served as Senior Legal and Strategic Advisor to the Prop. 47 campaign, a voter-approved 2014 California ballot initiative that eliminated felony punishment for low level drug possession and theft crimes and redirected cost savings into community-based rehabilitative and reentry programs.

Mr. Hopper has been involved in the drafting of statewide ballot initiatives to legalize, tax and regulate cannabis and has worked closely with top public opinion research firms testing various approaches to legalization as well as broader criminal justice reform and mass incarceration issues. He has also worked extensively with local government officials and stakeholders on criminal justice and medical marijuana regulatory issues, including collaborating with Santa Cruz County supervisors, County Counsel and members of the medical marijuana industry seeking to improve local cultivation ordinances. Mr. Hopper has co-authored law review articles analyzing the complex intersection of federal and state marijuana laws, as well as California's prison overcrowding crisis and political resistance from the organized law enforcement lobby to reforming the state's sentencing laws. Mr. Hopper published an analysis of the continued validity of state medical marijuana laws after the U.S. Supreme Court's 2005 decision in Gonzales v. Raich, and a similar analysis of the constitutional validity of Prop. 19, the 2010 California marijuana legalization ballot initiative. He has been quoted extensively in the national news media on numerous criminal justice topics, including the intersection of federal and state drug laws. He has also litigated these issues in federal and state courts, including, among other cases, defeating San Diego County's challenge to all California medical marijuana laws as preempted by federal law (San Diego County v. NORML, 165 Cal.App.4th 798 (2008), rev. den. (2008), cert. den. 556 U.S. 1235 (2009), and bringing a Tenth Amendment challenge to federal law enforcement practices targeting medical marijuana patients and providers working collaboratively with local government officials. (County of Santa Cruz v. Gonzales, No. C 03-01802 JF, 2008 WL 3892019 (N.D. Cal. Aug. 20, 2008)). Mr. Hopper also testified as a constitutional law expert before the California State Assembly Public Safety Committee's historic hearings on the legalization of marijuana in 2009.

Mr. Hopper received his B.A. in 1988 from New College of Florida, that state's public honors college, and his J.D. from the University of California, Davis, in 1992, where he received the Martin Luther King, Jr., Award for Public Service. Before joining the staff of the ACLU, Mr. Hopper's private practice focused on criminal defense, prisoners' rights and police misconduct litigation and he was a staff attorney for the California Appellate Project in San Francisco, established by the California Supreme Court and the California State Bar to oversee and provide case assistance to the lawyers appointed by the Court to represent death row defendants in their state and federal post-conviction proceedings.
