PUBLIC COMMENTS

Members of the public may address the Commission on any matter not listed on the Agenda. Please complete a "Request to Speak" form and limit your comments to three minutes. When you are called to speak, please come forward and state your name and city of residence for the record.

In response to Government Code Section 54954.2, members of the Commission may only: 1) respond briefly to statements made or questions posed by the public; 2) ask a question for clarification; 3) make a brief report on his or her own activities; 4) provide a reference to staff or other resources for factual information; 5) request staff to report back to the Commission at a subsequent meeting concerning any matter raised by the public; or 6) direct staff to place a matter of business on a future agenda . Unless otherwise authorized by the Commission, public comments shall be limited to three minutes.

URGENCY ITEMS

1. REPAINTING OF THE RAINBOW CROSSING

Background: Last year the Commission approved the rainbow crossing project that was painted near the bell tower in Townsquare. The rainbow crossing has since faded. This proposal is to repaint the crossing prior to the upcoming LGBT event which is March 24 2017. The paint will be donated. Several volunteers have already committed to helping repaint and refresh the rainbow crossing in time for the upcoming LGBT Days event.

Recommendation: Motion to approve repainting the rainbow crossing by March 24 2017 at no cost to the Public Arts Fund.

2. PROPOSAL TO SPONSOR CATHEDRAL CITY HIGH SCHOOL'S ANNUAL MUSIC CONCERT EVENT, THE STARDUST ARTS EXPO

Background: The Cathedral City High School is hosting The Stardust Arts Expo in February an event for the students and parents. Background: The 7th annual Chalk Festival event is Saturday March 11 at Palm Springs High School (2401 East Baristo Rd). The annual event is cosponsored with the Palm Springs Rotary. The Cathedral City Public Arts Commission has supported this event in the past with funding and assistance with judging at the event. The organizers of the event are requesting support from the Cathedral City's Arts Commission for this year's event. Attached to this agenda is a list of sponsorship options.

5. RENAME OUR CITY GALLERY THE CATHEDRAL CITY CULTURAL ART MUSEUM

Background: Business owners in Cathedral City see tourism increased with an ongoing attraction such as the Cathedral City Cultural Arts Museum. Adding Museum to the name would help qualify the Commission for possible county, state and federal grants focusing on local culture, diversity, youth art projects, and outreach to local artists. There are private funding options for museums as well, which we can apply for through grant writers. The renaming could allow for a naming rights fund raising option.

Recommendation: Motion to rename City Gallery to Cathedral City Cultural Arts Museum.

6. MURALS PROJECT

Background: Discuss the issues involved with starting a city-wide mural program in Cathedral City coordinated by a Sub Committee of the Public Arts Commission.

Goals/Activities:

Coordinate City Regulations regarding murals with the PAC's Long Range Plan (correct title).

Meet with City Staff to discuss current regulations and any anticipated changes.

-Develop specific plans for how to announce and seek locations for murals.

Build a budget for the program

Name a subcommittee of PAC Commissioners and seek community members for the subcommittee.

Recommendation: Discuss options, with at least one PAC Member to lead the committee and work with city council.
