RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt a Resolution declaring the results of the November 8, 2016 election as certified by the Riverside County Registrar of Voters.

BACKGROUND:

A general municipal election was held on November 8, 2016 in the City of Cathedral City. The purpose of this election was to do the following:

Elect one (1) Mayor for a full two (2) year term

Elect two (2) Members of the City Council for a full four (4) year term

Consider Measure P - Amending the Medical Cannabis Collective Tax that would expand the tax to apply to recreational cannabis, if legalized, and apply a tax of \$25 per square foot of cultivation space, and \$1.00 for every gram of cannabis concentrate and every unit of cannabis-infused product.

Consider Measure HH - Adoption of a City Charter.

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CATHEDRAL CITY, CALIFORNIA, RECITING THE FACT OF THE REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN SAID CITY ON NOVEMBER 8, 2016, DECLARING THE RESULT THEREOF AND SUCH OTHER MATTERS AS PROVIDED BY LAW

WHEREAS, a Regular Election was held and conducted in the City of Cathedral City, California, on Tuesday, November 8, 2016; and

WHEREAS, notice of the election was given in time, form and manner as provided by law; that voting precincts were properly established; that election officers were appointed and that in all respects the election was held and conducted and the votes were cast, received and canvassed and the returns made and declared in time, form and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of elections in general law cities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 2016-29, adopted July 13, 2016, the Riverside County Registrar of Voters canvassed the returns of the election and has certified the results to this City Council, said results are received, attached and made a part hereof as "Exhibit A."

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CATHEDRAL CITY, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Per Election Code 10264, The City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City Council of the City, a statement of the result of the election showing: (1) The whole number of ballots cast in the City; (2) The names of the persons voted for; (3) the measure voted for; (4) For what office each person was voted for; (5) The number of votes given at each precinct to each person, and for and against the measure; (6) The total number of votes given to each person, and for and against each measure.

SECTION 2. That said Regular Election was held for the purpose of electing the following officials of said City:

One (1) Mayor of said City for a full term of two (2) years

Two (2) Members of the City Council of said City for the full term of four (4) years

The names of the persons voted for at said election are as follows:

Mayor of said City: Stan Henry

Member of City Council of said City: John B. Aguilar Sergio Espericueta Gregory Pettis

SECTION 3. That said Regular Election was also held for the purpose of considering Measure P and Measure HH as follows:

SECTION 4.	That the whole numb	er of ballots cast i	n the precincts except vote by mai

SECTION 4. That the whole number of ballots cast in the precincts except vote by mail **5,058**, that the whole number of voter by mail voter ballots cast in the City was **10,634**, making a total of **15,692** ballots cast in the City.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> That the number of votes given at each precinct and the number of votes given in the City to each of the persons named above for office for which said persons were candidates for and the number of votes for and against Measure P and Measure HH, are listed in the attached Exhibit "A".

SECTION 6. The City Council declares and determines the following:

- (a) That the voters have elected Stan Henry as Mayor of said City for the full term of two (2) years;
- (b) That the voters have elected John B. Aguilar and Gregory Pettis as Members of the City Council for the full term of four (4) years;
- (c) That the voters have approved Measure P Amending the Medical Cannabis Collective Tax in said City;
 - (d) That the voters have approved Measure HH Adoption of a Charter in said City.
- **SECTION 7.** Per Election Code 10265, the City Clerk shall immediately make and deliver to each of the person so elected a Certificate of election signed by the City Clerk and authenticated; that the City Clerk shall also administer to each person elected the Oath of Office

prescribed in the Constitution of the State of California and shall have them subscribe to it and file it on the office of the City Clerk. Each and all of the persons so elected shall then be inducted into the respective office to which they were elected.

SECTION 8. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original Resolutions of said City; and shall make a minute of passage and adoption thereof in the records of the proceedings of the City Council of said City, in the minutes of the meeting at which the same is passed and adopted.

Selection of Mayor Pro Tem

FROM:

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council select a Council Member to serve as Mayor Pro Tem for a two-year term.

BACKGROUND:

Traditionally the City Council will select a Mayor Pro Tem to serve a two-year term after each election. According to the current City Council Policy Manual, the Mayor Pro Tem will serve in the capacity of the Mayor during their absence or disability.

DISCUSSION:

With the approval of the City Charter in the November 8, 2016, Election, beginning in 2018, there will be an approved policy in place on how the rotating Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem are selected. The proposed policy will be presented to Council in January 2017. The current two year term for Mayor Pro Tem will fall under the existing City Council Policy Manual as the Charter provision related to the Mayoral rotation does not take effect until the end of the current Mayor's term (December 2018).
